Charles: I think they have been so many sculptures which have treated solid things as flat.

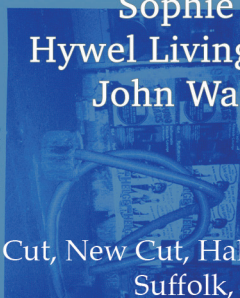
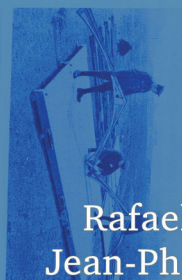
John: Do you mean using sculptures as images?
