Research Timeline

Date	Rationale of research activities and decisions undertaken
September 2013	Awarded a grant of £30,704 from North Devon FLAG (Fisheries Local Action Group) for a collaborative research and public engagement project with Ilfracombe Museum, Dr Kyriaki Hadjiafxendi (Bath Spa University) and Professor John Plunkett (Exeter University) on 'Science at the Seaside: Pleasure Hunts in North Devon'.
January- September 2014	Programme of research and public engagement activities delivered in collaboration with Ilfracombe Musuem (see activities leaflets for more details).
November 2013- September 2014	Research into the Ilfracombe Museum collection related to nineteenth-century natural history, collection and the growth of Ilfracombe as a tourist destination. This research fed into both a commissioned chapter for an OUP collection, and the items that were to be digitized and made publicly available via E-Hive with meta-data.
July 2014	Launch of new permanent exhibition (cases and display boards) and exhibition guide at Ilfracombe Museum devoted to seaside science and the rise of North Devon as a tourist destination, based on research into artefacts in the museum collection and other primary sources.

October 2014	Launch of Ilfracombe Museum digital E-hive collection containing circa 2700 items from the collection, which is freely available and searchable (see E-hive information and supporting documentation).
January 2015 January 2016	Further research on nineteenth-century natural history and popular science and the influence of the work of Phillip H Gosse, Charles Kingsley, George Henry Lewes and other visitors to North Devon at Ilfracombe Museum and Gosse Family papers at Cambridge University. Submission of chapter to OUP collection in January 2016.
July 2017	Publication of co-authored article with Professor John Plunkett, 'Science at the Seaside: Pleasure Hunts in Victorian Devon', in Coastal Works: Cultures of the Atlantic Edge. Editors: Groom N, Smith J. pp. 181-203. Oxford University Press, Oxford 2017.
