Research Questions

- What are the actual behaviours that constitute artists' creativity and can they help us to rethink the ways in which we teach and learn art? Can the institutional methods that have evolved for appreciating, evaluating and enabling creativity be reconsidered to accommodate a broader spectrum of activities?
- Can a better acquaintance with the conditions that precipitate, encircle, or influence art making bring into focus and legitimise what is otherwise seen to be non-productive activity? Might artists' preparatory, and sometimes diversionary, activities have been

subjected to hierarchies that need to be reassessed?

- What conditions (cultural, sociological, economic, political) might these behaviours be shaped by?
 How do artists' habits form and how do they betray aspects of our personality, economic conditions, privileges (or lack of), commitments, mental or physical health, age etc.?
- Within the context of current educational preoccupations with evidencing and measuring production, could the performing of artists' behaviours in the public realm help us to understand creative processes better?
 What happens when these behaviours are performed in a gallery and how might embodying the behaviours of another artist influence one's own creativity or understanding of creativity?
