18-20 May 2015	<p><b><i>Text Versus Art</i> Conference, The University of Łódź</b></p> <p>Presented a conference paper. This paper begins to outline thoughts on the shifts between image, text and speech.</p>
26-27 September 2015	<p>Delivered the keynote for <b><i>Next to Nothing</i> Conference for the University of Newcastle, Australia.</b></p> <p>Title of paper <i>A flickering Institution</i></p> <p>The keynote presentation continues to explore the zones of transaction between performing, writing, drawing, and painting, building on the paper given at Łódź. This was also a Visiting Professor role and a Residency which allowed for the development of a new drawing/performance at the Lock Up Gallery, Newcastle, Australia (4-27 Sept 2015).</p>
15-30 October 2015	<p><b><i>Art/Text</i>, NCUST gallery, Tangshan, China</b></p> <p>Co-curated exhibition with Annie Xu which explored the relationships between ideogram and symbol. Also included a wall text by Dutton and Xu.</p>

Co-Curated exhibition ( Dutton, Xu ) in which Dutton exhibited the work 'Que Sera Sera', a digital print, approx. 6ft x 4ft. This work took what ostensibly seems like the speech act of a child but through a process of linguistic play placed it in the context of a philosophically dense question about the nature of language.
