Mariele Neudecker creates work that responds to and interprets pioneering research by scientists. As a visiting artist at CERN, she was allowed access to the ALICE project at the Hadron Collider. This film immerses the viewer in the underground world of research into dark matter and provides a lens into this remarkable human endeavour. Neudecker captures the beauty of the scale and extremes of this experiment, where the tiniest particles are beamed through 27 kilometres of tunnels and through enormous magnetic portals, to shed light on the extraordinary adventures taken by quantum physicists today.
